Letters in Running Water

Recently, I had an opportunity to attend the inter-faith conference hosted by the Moslem community. After a presentation by each representative on the theme "The Concept of Salvation" there was a "question and answer" period. One of the questions we were asked to respond to was "How can we deal with our enemies?" That is, "How can we get along with those whom we hate?"

"Love your enemy." is a well known phrase. We all know this but it is not easy to practice.

Buddhists talk about oneness of all life. We talk about a life of inter-dependence and inter-connectedness. In this respect there is no "enemy" from the beginning. Our dualistic thoughts create the world of "two-ness" or duality, I and you. Then we say, "I like you." or "I hate you." "Enemy" is our own creation by the thoughts of self-centered mind. Our "enemy" is actually can be found within us! Our self centered mind and thoughts are our enemy. After I responded, I asked myself, "How can we deal with the enemy within?"

It is said in Buddhism that there are three kinds of people in the world. The first are those who are like letters carved in rock; they easily give way to anger and hate and retain their thoughts for

a long time. The second are those who are like letters written in sand; they give way to anger and hate also, but their thoughts quickly pass away. The third are those who are like letters written in running water; they do not retain their passing thoughts. They let abuse and uncomfortable gossip pass by unnoticed. Their minds are always pure and undisturbed.

Those who are like letters written in running water represents Buddhas, awakened ones whose minds have no thoughts of "I", "Me" and "Mine". To which kind of people do I belong, then? I must admit that I belong to those who are like letters carved in rock, probably until I die. My mind and thoughts are tainted badly with a strong attachment of self-centeredness. This is the reason that Buddhas, whose essence is the spirit of oneness and a heart of great compassion, are illuminating and nurturing my life every day. I must hear and return to this mind, pure, real and sincere.

I remember the words of my teacher: "The bountifulness of great compassion makes possible our spiritual liberation from the iron cage of our own making."

ate on Monday, May 19, 2008, Fujikawa Socho and three visitors from the In-Governor Deguchi, Rev. Kiribayashi, and Rev. Hayashi arrived in Lethbridge from Japan to take a look at what we were doing with amalgamation. The next day several board and temple members who were available met for breakfast and then a meeting at the north temple in order for us to show them how we are proceeding. They were interested in how we are managing the amalgamation of four temples because they say that there is the possibility of additional amalgamations in other regions. We showed them our governance documents and had a frank discussion about finances for building the new temple. At the site of the new temple we were shown what is happening by the framer. We had further discussions at the south temple. At this point Fujikawa socho had to return to Vancouver. Additional discussion and visits to the Nikka Yuko garden and Coaldale temple followed

lunch. It was an honour for us to be the only visitation site for the visitors who were on there way to a meeting in San Fransisco.

On May 25, 2008 we held a special general meeting to address a few changes to our by-laws that would bring them into compliance with the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission requirements for a casino license and with a request by our accountant for an indemnification clause. Additional changes from the floor were also made. The changes were all passed by the 29 members attending. A quorum, 5% of the membership, was easily achieved. If you would like a copy of the amended by-laws please contact me or any board member.

Now a comment on membership. As you know from past newsletters our members were all "grandfathered" in from the amalgamation on January 1, 2007. In 2008 our membership fee was set at \$50 per member. This is a transition year for us because members in different temples had differences regarding

membership fee. We have a membership committee that has been reviewing our list. Not everyone has rejoined the BTSA so unfortunately at some point we will have to release the non-paying members from our list. There is a financial reason for this; we pay a \$55 per year assessment per member to the Jodo Shinshu Buddhist Temples of Canada (JSBTC) and we have to pay postage for a newsletter each month that amounts to a further \$6 per member. If you are not sure what your status is, please contact me and I will let you know what our records indicate. We don't want anyone cut off so please let us know. I also want to emphasize that we understand that there are different situations. For any member who is not able to renew their membership for any reason, please contact me or a member of the board. We are not charging memberships for any seniors who are infirm or who otherwise are not able to get in touch with us.

BTSA Fundraising Update to mid-May, 2008

The BTSA now has an official status as a charitable organization. Official tax receipts can now be issued by the BTSA for any charitable donations. The target for the fund raising committee is around \$750,000. The donor levels are as follows:
